

Halifax Resolves Chapter

The Halifax Resolves Chapter dedicated an SAR Patriot Marker at the grave of Col. John Whitaker in the Whitaker's Chapel Cemetery east of Enfield, N.C. The marker recognizes Whitaker's



service during the Revolutionary War.

Whitaker was born May 2, 1747. In February 1776 Whitaker, along with Capt. Pope, were dispatched from Halifax with their company of militia to assist patriot forces

at the Battle of Moore's Creek Bridge. When they arrived, the battle was over, so they then assisted other patriot forces in capturing the retreating Tory forces.

Whitaker was promoted to major and lietenant colonel and served as a collector of customs. On Feb. 2, 1779, the North Carolina General Assembly commissioned him as colonel in command of the 200 Light Horse Cavalry of Halifax County. He remained in command until resigning his commission in February 1780. Whitaker also served as a member of the North Carolina General Assembly in 1778, 1779 and 1785, representing Halifax County.

He died July 20, 1816.







HALIFAX, N.C. - The Halifax Resolves Chapter, North Carolina Society of the Sons of the American Revolution hosted two ceremonies in Halifax on the 238th Anniversary of the Adoption of the Halifax Resolves, which was April 12, 1776.

The day of celebration began at 10 a.m. with a Joint SAR/DAR Flag Retirement ceremony at which 40 unserviceable U.S. flags and several state flags were retired with honor and the ashes buried in a local cemetery by the Burn Master.





The second place went to the poster from California and thus the North Carolina poster won the top national spot for the first time ever, Wilson said. "Because it's No.

1, it's hanging in the (SAR) hall in Louisville, Ky.," Wilson said. The poster will hang there for a year. he added.

To Wilson's knowledge, Francis Marion never came to this area of North Carolina. but he was from South Carolina and gave the British Army a hard time during the American Revolution.

"He was a great leader, and smart about

warfare," Beal said, adding Marion used guerilla tactics learned from his day warring with the Cherokee Nation. "I thought that was pretty cool."

Marion so disrupted the British they sent against him the infamous Lt. Col. Banastre Tarleton, who was no stranger to the Roanoke Valley, Wilson said. Tarleton pursued Marion who then escaped into a swamp, thus earning his nickname from Tarleton, according to Smithsonian.com.

The contest is open to all students in third through fifth grades (de pending on which year the American Revolution is taught in their school). Cornerstone

Academy also participated this year, and there were 32 local entries in total, Wilson said.

Belmont Elementary has participated in past years, and Cub Scouts, Brownies and members of Children of the American Revolution also can be eligible. The topics for the 2014-15 contest, to begin in January, will be "George Rogers Clark" or "Lexington and Concord." Keeping history alive is of supreme importance, Wilson said. "Take the Declaration of Independence," he

said. "If you don't know about its importance, what good is it?"



Sons of American Revolution honor late patriot

LITTLETON - Roanoke Rapids resident Christy King was chock-full of pride when discussing her ancestry this weekend. Just outside of

Littleton on Saturday afternoon her ancestor, Joseph Shearin II, was given a dedication by the Sons of the American Revolution.

As part of the dedication, a granite slab

was placed near his tombstone to commemorate his service.

Although Shearin was not a solider in the American Revolution, he helped the cause by supplying weapons to the armory in Halifax, according to Ken Wilson, state president of the National Society Sons of the American Revolution and one of many members attend-

ing. From information Wilson gathered, he said with the word 'patriot' Shearin served on many

juries and grand juries. Wilson noted Shearin was too old to fight in the American Revolution and died in 1790.

added he feels young people today do not receive enough education about the colonial era of the United States.




