

# Constitution Day remembered

The Halifax Resolves SAR Chapter and the Halifax Resolves DAR Chapter placed a display in the Scotland Neck Memorial Library honoring the U.S. Constitution. Sept. 17, 1787, was the day the Constitution was created and it was ratified June 21, 1788, when New Hampshire, the ninth colony to do so, approved the document. Of the thirteen colonies that ratified the constitution, North Carolina was the 12th, doing so on Nov. 21, 1789. This display illustrates the chain of events from the adoption of the Halifax Resolves to the Declaration of Independence, the Constitution and the Bill of Rights.
