Upcoming NCSSAR Events

President Wilson reported on the following chapter activities since our September meeting:

- He acted as part of the Color Guard at the October and November veteran's ceremonies at the Roanoke Valley Veteran's Center
- He awarded 5 SAR Flag Certificates
- He attended the Fall NCSSAR Board of Managers meeting at Chapel Hill, where he accepted the SAR Partners in Patriotism certificate on behalf of the Chapter. Steve Avent was presented a certificate for the Carl F. Bessent newsletter award in which the Chapter's newsletter placed 2nd nationally.
- He represented the Chapter at the October meeting of AMVETS Post 101 where he discussed the upcoming Veteran's Day Parade in Roanoke Rapids
- He participated in the graveside ceremony for Pearl Harbor survivor Bill Thorpe.
- He participated in the Veteran's Parade and ceremony at Veteran's Park in Roanoke Rapids.
- He is currently working with the Roanoke Rapids Christmas Parade committee for the December 5 parade.
- Participation by the Chapter Color Guard was requested for the Wreaths Across America ceremony to be held December 11 at Cedarwood Cemetery in Roanoke Rapids.
- Plans are in the works for participation in the Pearl Harbor Remembrance ceremony to be held at the Veteran's Center on December 7.
- The Chapter has retired over 528 US Flags during 2010. Currently we have collected approximately 90 US Flags to be retired.
- The Chapter will be submitting the Chapter Achievement Report to the State Society for consideration at the Annual Convention. The Chapter was the statewide winner of the contest last year for chapters with less than 50 members.
- The following will be submitted to the National SAR for consideration at the next National Congress:
 - * the Chapter newsletter
 - * the Chapter website
 - * the Chapter will be entered in the President's Cup competition
- We have had excellent participation in the Knight Essay contest and the JROTC competition:
 - * the JROTC winner was AFJROTC Cadet Command Sgt. Major Ter-Jo Lumsden of J. S. Webb HS in Oxford.
 - * the winner of the Chapter's Knight Essay competition was James E. Elliott

Ken presented the Law Enforcement Commendation Medal to Assistant US Attorney Joshua B. Royster, who accepted it with thanks and recognized the members of his task force and local law enforcement who were crucial to the success of the project.

The Chapter was honored with a visit by Dr. Sam Powell, Past NCSSAR President, and Past VP-General of the South Atlantic District. Sam spoke briefly on SAR activities at the national level. He reported that SAR membership is up nationally, with about 29,000 current members (an increase of 1500 over last year) and added that membership is trending steadily upward. He reported on some of the activities taking place at the Chapter level, including the Knight Essay contest, the Rumbaugh Oration contest, the Eagle Scout recognition program, the Americanism poster contest, member visits to schools and others.

He then reported on the status of the major project the SAR is engaged in at the national level—the Center for Advancing America's Heritage (Sam is the National Chairman of the Capital Campaign for the CAAH). To date, 6.5 million dollars have been raised for the project, but another 5 million are still needed.

The Center will house our new interactive Galleries, the Drinkard Education Center, Genealogical Research Library, Merchandise Operations, and our National Headquarters. From the National SAR website (www.sar.org): "The need for The Center for Advancing America's Heritage, with its focus on the founding values of this great nation, is clear. National surveys indicate that historical illiteracy grips the nation. Pulitzer-prize winning historian David McCullough notes that in many schools, "American History is being put on the back burner or taken off the stove altogether." The Center ensures that the stories of our patriot ancestors' struggles against tyranny and the principles upon which our country was founded are preserved so succeeding generations will enjoy the inestimable blessings of being an American. "

He then reported on planning for the upcoming SAR National Congress, to be hosted by the NCSSAR and held in Winston-Salem July 9-13. We can expect about 600 attendees from all across the country, and he encouraged all NCSSAR members to attend the event and help out. Volunteers will not be required to pay the registration fee of \$250, and we will begin signing up volunteers in March.

At the November meeting the SAR Good Citizenship Medal was presented to Chapter member Allen Brahin for his services as Chapter Registrar and his active participation in the Chapter and State Color Guards. He also presented the Law Enforcement Commendation Medal to Assistant US Attorney Joshua Royster.

On December 15, Ken presented the SAR Outstanding Cadet award to Cadet Teri-Jo Lumsden, a junior at J. F. Webb High School in Oxford. The award included an Olympic style medal with ribbon, a certificate and a check for \$50. Teri-Jo, the daughter of Denise Walther of Oxford, is the JROTC Battalion Supply Officer and is a member of the National Honor Society. He also awarded the Knight Essay contest medal and certificate, and a check for \$50, to James Dylan Elliott, for his winning essay on the Saratoga Campaign. Dylan, a junior at J. F. Webb High School, is the son of Michael and Alice Elliott of Oxford. He is also the JROTC Battalion Operations officer and a member of the Webb High School jazz band.

Also on December 15th, Ken presented the SAR Certificate of Appreciation to Lt. Col. Joe Gibbs, USA (Ret.) senior military science instructor at J.F. Webb High School for his unit's participation in programs sponsored by the Chapter. The Webb JROTC cadets participated in in both the Knight Essay and Outstanding JROTC Cadet contests, and they had winners in each.

The SAR also has had among its members Sir Winston Churchill and King Juan Carles I of Spain, both of whom trace their ancestry to REVOLU-TIONARY WAR patriots Membership requires proof of descent from a person who aided in the PATRIOT cause. Some of the activities in which we engage are:

- * educational programs in the schools and elsewhere on the ideals of our Patriot ancestors and the American Revolution
- * recognition of outstanding law enforcement officers and JROTC cadets
