Highlights of November, 2016 meeting

The November, 2016 meeting of the Halifax Resolves Chapter, NCSSAR, was held on Wednesday, November 9, 2016 at the Halifax United Methodist Church in Halifax, NC. President Ken Wilson called the meeting to order at 6:30 pm. An invocation was given by Compatriot Carlton Garner, and then all present joined in the Pledge of Allegiance to the US Flag. President Wilson led the members in the SAR Pledge. Special guests NCSSAR President Gary Green and SAR Foundation President Dr. Sam Powell were introduced to the group.

President Green reminded everyone of his goals for the year: (1) retention. (2) communication, and (3) recognition of veterans within the SAR.

Dr. Powell gave an update on the building of the SAR Museum in Louisville.

In the absence of Secretary/Treasurer Steve Avent, President Wilson briefly discussed the minutes from the previous meeting, which were approved. The Treasurer's report indicated a total balance of \$2099.41, of which the subcategories include the Youth Fund with a balance of \$1670.00 and the General Fund with a balance of \$429.41. After a brief discussion, the Treasurer's report was approved.

There was no unfinished business on the agenda.

Under new business, President Wilson discussed the status of our Chapter Color Guard. It has been decided to disband the Color Guard because we only have four members, of which only two are readily available. He also reminded members of the upcoming need to purchase replacement flags and a banner.

President Wilson next presented a number of awards from our chapter:
