

# Message from the President



Compatriots,

A lot has transpired since our last meeting. Sec.-Treas. Steve Avent and I attended the Patriot's Day ceremony at Alamance Battle-ground, where we participated in the Color Guard and I presented the chapter wreath. I also had the honor of participating with the AMVETS Color Guard at the Memorial Day Ceremony and I also presented the chapter wreath. The June ceremony at the Dallas

Jones Roanoke Valley Veterans' Center honored Sgt. Willie McLawhorn of Northampton Co. who was killed in action earlier this year. Sec.-Treas. Avent assisted me with the color guard duties posting, retiring and folding the colors for presentation to the family. I wish to thank Sec.-Treas. Avent, Past President Ron Jones and Chaplain Rev. Duncan Jones for their assistance in conducting the Flag Retirement ceremony at Jackson that we cosponsored with BSA Troop 834. Even with the hot weather, we had a good turnout from the public. There were 203 U.S. flags retired at this event bringing the YTD total to 401.

We are running short on time now for the new slate of officers. As of this writing we have not received any suggestions or nominations from the membership. I had hoped someone would step forward, there is still time if you are considering an office. The nominations will be presented at the September meeting.

The chapter will be sponsoring a dual grave marking ceremony at the Shady Grove UMC in Inez, Warren Co. on October 22 at 2:00. We will mark the grave of Patriot Burwell Davis, ancestor of our Past NCSSAR President and chapter member Dr. Samuel C. Powell. Davis's wife was the sister of our Past Chapter President Dr. Cleveland Hawkins' ancestor. The second half of the ceremony will be the marking of Compatriot David Koontz's grave. Compatriot Koontz was a member of the Alamance Battleground Chapter NCSSAR. He had served as the Chapter President of the Alamance Battleground Chapter, and NCSSAR Genealogist along with various other offices. Compatriot Koontz's wife, Sarah is also a descendant of Burwell Davis.

We are currently working on another grave marking at the Rose Hill Plantation near Nashville for Patriot Nathan Boddie. If this comes to fruition, it could be the largest event ever sponsored by the chapter.

Throughout its 120-year history, the SAR has admitted more than 155.000 members. Among them are 16 PRESI-DENTS of the UNITED STATES, including George W. Bush and his father George H. W. Bush, Jimmy Carter, Dwight D. Eisenhower. Harry Truman and Theodere Rooseveit. The SAR also has had among its members Sir Winston Churchill and King Juan Carles I of Spain, both of whom trace their ancestry to REVOLU-TIONARY WAR patriots Membership requires proof of descent from a person who aided in the PATRIOT cause. Some of the activities in which we engage are:

- \* educational programs in the schools and elsewhere on the ideals of our Patriot ancestors and the American Revolution
