The Halifax Resolves Chapter NCSSAR met at the Halifax United Methodist Church on Wednesday, July 14th at 6:30 pm.

President Geoff Pittard called the meeting to order and the invocation was given by Chapter VP RJ Myrick. The Sec/Treas read the minutes of the previous meeting, which were approved. He then gave the Treasurer's report, reporting that the Chapter had \$1085.84 in the checking account.

Guests Ed Porter and Jonathan Martin, local firefighters from Conway VFD who are being honored by the chapter tonight, were recognized at their seats. Former Chapter President Ken Wilson, who is now the NCSSAR State President was also recognized, and gave a few remarks:

- -discussed the recent "Forgotten Patriots" grave marking, in which the graves of 14 Black Patriots were marked near Havelock, NC -updated the chapter on the status of the NSSAR Center for Advancing America's Heritage
- -discussed the NCSSAR's USO Challenge, and stated that they hope to receive at least \$250 in contributions from NC chapters
- -there is a Memorial Day ceremony taking place at Cedarwood Cemetery in Roanoke Rapids at 9:30 am
- -there is a Flag Retirement ceremony tentatively scheduled for Enfield, NC on 6/7
- -the NC Board of Managers meeting is scheduled for 8/23 in Raleigh

President Pittard then discussed new business:

- -the need for increased participation by chapter members
- -S. Granville HS has its JROTC awards ceremony scheduled for 5/16
- -"Patriot's Day" will be held at the Alamance Battleground on May 17
- -there is a dual SAR grave marking being held in Franklin, NC on 5/18
- -there will be a ceremony commemorating Buford's Massacre held in Waxhaws, SC on 5/24

He then called forward local firefighters Ed Porter and Jonathan Martin and presented them with the SAR Heroism medal for rescuing an unconscious victim form a burning house.

President Pittard then gave a most interesting and informative talk on French and Spanish involvement in the American Revolution, showing how crucial their support was in the winning of American independence.
