Highlights of the 10/9/05 NCSSAR Board of Managers meeting

The Board of Managers is composed of State NCSSAR officers and Chapter Presidents and meets in the Spring and Fall. It conducts the business of the NCSSAR and all members are welcome to attend. Here are some highlights of the most recent meeting:

- * The meeting opened at 1115 hours by President Joe E. Harris, Jr., with the advancement of the Colors by the East Rowan High School Army JROTC under command of Cadet LTC Emily Horton. Emily was the NC JROTC outstanding cadet for 2005 and is now a senior at East Rowan and commander of the Cadet Corps.
- * Welcoming remarks followed by the President as well as a greeting by the Sons of the Revolution, NC, State president and the CAR (Children of the American Revolution) Public Relations Chairman, Miss Emma Hodson. Miss Rachel Horne, NC State CAR President was also present and gave greetings from the State CAR organization. Both young ladies told the group about the CAR National project, raising money for the WW II museum in New Orleans and the NCCAR project raising money for the Joel Lane House. The President presented the CAR with a print of the 29th Infantry Division storming the beach at Normandy on 6 June 1944. (It was the 29th Division under BG Norman Cota who broke thorough the German defenses at Normandy and allowed the American forces to advance off the beach.) It is hoped that the CAR can auction the print off for money to support their projects. (The Children of the American Revolution is a great organization for children and youths, and is becoming very active in NC. If you have children or grandchildren—think about membership for them.)
- * The meeting resumed about 1200 hours with a SAR outreach briefing by the President. The briefing subject was the planned Center for Advancing America's Heritage (see further in this newsletter for more information about the CAAH).
- * Each year the SAR holds a National Congress in some major city, and SAR members attend from all over. 2011 is the hundredth anniversary of the founding of the NCSSAR, so we are hoping to be able to host the National Congress that year to top off what will be many special events that will be planned to commemorate the anniversary. Compatriot Dr. Sam C. Powell of the Alamance Battleground Chapter reported that the 2006 National SAR Congress will be in Dallas; 2007 in Williamsburg, VA; 2008 somewhere in CA; 2009 in Atlanta; 2010 in Cleveland and 2011 in North Carolina. He emphasized that NC was "penciled" in but that a proposal had not been made as to location and dates to the National committee yet. It would appear that NC is the strongest contender for the 2011 date.
- * The 2006 Fund Raising Project was presented by Sr. VP Powell. This project was the purchase and raffling of a Virginia long rifle, powder pouch and powder horn to be purchased for \$2500 and raffled at \$100 a ticket. The long rifle will be made by a company located in Fuquay-Varina. (You'll be hearing more about this as details become available).
- * Compatriot Steve Avent, Halifax Resolves Chapter President then announced that the next Halifax memorial will be on a week-end nearest to April 12, the day the Resolves were signed in Halifax. (More on this elsewhere in this newsletter.)

The Center for Advancing America's Heritage

NSSAR President General Roland G. Dowling has proposed the creation of a new facility that will revolutionize the NSSAR and enable it to carry out its mission more effectively. Here is how he describes it:

What is the Center for Advancing America's Heritage?

Simply put, the Center represents the future of the National Society of the Sons of the American Revolution.

The Goal of the Society is to raise \$6 million for the Center, of which roughly \$3 million is needed to initiate construction of the facility, and \$3 million to endow its educational outreach programs.

Construction and operation of the Center will:

Provide a much needed expansion of SAR's historical and genealogical research capabilities through a larger, modern Library. This will offer increased opportunities for the public and students of history, genealogy, political science and other disciplines to examine significant works, collections and records pertaining to the Revolutionary War period.

Allow the SAR Museum to expand into the space it requires to more fully display its historic collections.

Provide audio visual space and capabilities for quality education programs for teachers and students on Americanism, and promote an understanding of the Revolutionary War period by focusing on the inspiring events associated with the founding of our country.

Enhance educational outreach programs and curriculum regarding the Revolutionary War period via internet, printed material and live and recorded media presentations.

Promote patriotism through educational programs emphasizing the value of unity and an American identity to new Americans and students originally from non-English speaking populations.

Launch and further develop an educational outreach website, and obtain supporting grants and fund professional staff to carry out these new, ambitious outreach programs.

Expand the focus and increase the role of NSSAR in accomplishing the mission of the SAR.

Your contributions and pledges will go a long way toward supporting our educational outreach goals as set forth in the SAR Constitution:

..." to inspire the community-at-large with a more profound reverence for the principles of the government founded by our forefathers...to foster true patriotism, to maintain and extend the institutions of American freedom..."

The Sons of the American Revolution is a patriotic organization formed in 1889 and chartered by the U.S. Congress in 1906, with more than 25,000 living members from all 50 states and 23 foreign countries. Throughout its 116-year history, the SAR has admitted more than 155,000 members. Among them are 16 Presidents of the United States, including George W. Bush and his father George H. W. Bush, Jimmy Carter, Dwight D. Eisenhower, Harry Truman and Theodore Roosevelt. The SAR also has had among its members Sir Winston Churchill and King Juan Carlos I of Spain, both of whom trace their ancestry to Revolutionary War patriots. Membership requires proof of descent from a person who aided in the Patriot cause. Some of the activities in which we engage are:

- * commemoration of patriot graves and monuments
- * educational programs in the schools and elsewhere on the ideals of our Patriot ancestors and the American Revolution
- * recognition of outstanding law enforcement officers and JROTC cadets
- * sponsorship of Boy Scout troops
