

Message from the President



Compatriots,

It has been a pleasure and an honor to serve as your president over the last two years. We have come a long way in our outreach to the community and I hope we will continue to do so in the future.

Our youth contests are slowly but surely growing. I have learned that the best way into most of the public schools is through the JROTC. We have different units who participate in both the Enhanced JROTC and the Knight Essay contests. The poster contest this past spring saw an increase from one to two schools.

Another area of outreach is our flag retirements. Since we allowed the scouts to assist at the Halifax ceremony in April, they were active in Jackson also. Scout masters are giving instruction using our ceremonial drum after the ceremony has ended instead of having to add it into instruction at one of their other events where time is more restricted.

Finally, the Eagle Scout Recognition certificates awarded at the Eagle Scout Court of Honor have been a big help in opening doors that had been closed to us in the past.

Highlights of September, 2011 meeting

President Wilson reported on the following chapter activities since our July 2011 meeting:

- He participated in the August and September Veteran's ceremonies at the Roanoke Valley Veteran's Center and Museum
- He awarded four SAR Flag Certificates
- He represented the Chapter along with Se.-Treas Avent at the Gen. Isaac Gregory grave marking ceremony, sponsored by the Albemarle Chapter and held near Camden, NC
- He sent out packets for the youth contests to the area schools
- He participated in the planning of the 9-11 ceremony and also with the NCSSAR Combined Color Guard at the ceremony
- Currently actively participating in the planning of the Octo er 15 Flag Retirement ceremony wit VFW Post 1702, the Burwell Davis/ David Koontz grave marking and the Nathan Boddie grave marking.
- He is planning to attend the NCSSAR Board of Managers meeting on October 8.
- On Saturday, September 17, Constitution Day, our Chapter Registrar and Color Guard Commander Allen Brahin will represent the Chapter and State Society as a member of the National Color Guard by standing guard over the tomb of George Washington at Mount Vernon for one hour.
- Our Chapter Achievement contest point total is currently 7950.
- We have 110 flags awaiting retirement.

Ron Jones proposed that the Chapter Achievement Award points that are awarded for giving a SAR-related talk be increased, due to the planning and preparation and travel that are usually required for these talks. Ken brought up the Chapter's need for new members, and there was a discussion on various ways of attracting new members. He then discussed the many youth-related programs in which the Chapter is engaged and reported that our Chapter funds are insufficient for the various awards needed for these, and asked for donations from members to make up the shortfall and enable us to continue these important activities.

Chapter Activities

On October 22 the Chapter sponsored a grave marking ceremony for Patriot Burwell Davis and SAR member David Koontz at Shady Grove UMC near Inez, NC. The event was well attended by SAR participants as well as the general public, many of whom were descendants of Burwell Davis. Past Chapter President Cleveland Hawkins, who is related to Davis through marriage, also attended with his wife Doris. Past NCSSAR State President Sam Powell, another Davis descendant, was the keynote speaker.

On October 30 Ken presented the Society's Eagle Scout Recognition Certificate to Kevin Moore of BSA Troop 146 in Roanoke Rapids, at the Court of Honor recognizing Kevin's outstanding achievement and exceptional leadership and citizenship evidenced by his attainment of the rank of Eagle Scout.

Chapter Activities

On November 19 at 2:00 pm the Halifax Resolves Chapter will be marking the grave of Patriot Nathan Boddie, at his home and burial place Rose Hill Plantation, located near Nashville, NC. Here is his biography:

Nathan Boddie was born 22 February 1732 in Isle of Wight County, VA, eventually settling in Edgecombe (present day Nash) County, NC. He became a dominant figure in local and state affairs, representing Edgecombe County in the Fourth Provincial Congress that assembled in Halifax, NC, on April 4, 1776 and adopted the Halifax Resolves. As a member of the First General Assembly of North Carolina in 1777, Nathan sponsored the legislation that created Nash County from a part of Edgecombe. In addition, he was one of five justices charged with finding a location in Johnston, Wake or Chatham counties for the capital of North Carolina. At his death in 1797, Nathan was accorded many accolades, including the title Father of Nash County.


