

Message from the President



Compatriots,

I would like to thank the chapter for the opportunity to serve the last six years as a chapter officer, two years as VP and four years as President. The chapter has come a long way by the coordinated efforts of all the chapter officers. We have been able to participate in numerous NCSSAR and local events as well as events in
