The Halifax Resolves Chapter NCSSAR met at the Halifax United Methodist Church on Wednesday, September 10th at 6:30 pm.

President Geoff Pittard called the meeting to order and the invocation was given by Chaplain Duncan Jones. The Sec/Treas read the minutes of the previous meeting, which were approved. He then gave the Treasurer's report, reporting that the Chapter had \$1062.03 in the checking account.

President Geoff Pittard then gave his report:

-we have a Flag Retirement ceremony scheduled for 9/27/14 in Roanoke Rapids, co-sponsored with the VFW Chapter. -we are sponsoring a grave marking ceremony at the Shearin family cemetery near Littleton, NC, on 10/18/14

NCSSAR President Ken Wilson reported that he is planning a Flag Retirement ceremony late in November with the Enfield 4H Club. He also reported that the won the National Partners in Patriotism Award for chapters our size.

He then called former Chapter President Cleveland Hawkins forward and presented him with the NSSAR Lamplighter Award for his generous support of the NSSAR Center for Advancing America's Heritage.

President Wilson then gave a most interesting and informative presentation on the active role of the town of Halifax in the American Revolution, emphasizing the significant contributions made by the women of Halifax.

Carlton Garner reported that the Halifax Restoration Association is hoping to purchase a book on cavalry tactics written by local resident and important Revolutionary War figure William R. Davie and would appreciate contributions toward this effort. After discussion, it was decided to urge chapter members to contribute privately rather than have the chapter itself make a contribution.

-There being no further business, the benediction was given by Chaplain Duncan Jones and the meeting adjourned at 8:00 pm.


#### December 2014
