

Message from the President

Compatriots,

Gentlemen,

As all of you know, the NSSAR has been raising funds for the new building. The goal is for each State to have 20 percent of the membership donate an average of \$250. The NCSSAR has been growing and is now over 800 members. Twenty percent of the members would be 162 men. At present, 144 individuals have made donations. That makes a difference of 18 men. Then, we are growing so would need additional people to maintain the 20 percent. At your meetings, I hope that you will discuss the CAAH and the importance of having some place where people can study and learn about the American Revolution. I think that we can make the goal with a little effort.

Also, talk to your Chapters about making a Chapter donation of \$500. I know this is a lot of money for some Chapters but unless we try, we will never know what can be accomplished. To date, only the Lower Cape Fear Chapter has made a Chapter donation. We have 22 Chapters. I would challenge the other 21 Chapters to match the Lower Cape Fear Chapter.
