

### Patriot Marcum Cooper marking

Marcum Cooper was born 1740-43 in Northeastern NC, and died in 1811 in Nash Co.. He served several times on Grand and Petit juries in Nash Co. during 1778 and 1779, thus helping to keep the struggling colonial government functioning during the difficult times of the Revolution. To honor his contributions, on Saturday, November 22 the chapter placed a SAR Patriot grave marker at his grave, with appropriate ceremony.
