

The Sons of the American Revolution is a **PATRIOTIC** organization formed in 1889 and chartered by the U.S. Congress in 1906, with more than 25,000 living members from all 50 states and 23 foreign countries. Throughout its 119-year history, the SAR has admitted more than 155,000 members. Among them are 16 **PRESDENTS** of the **UNITED STATES**, including George W. Bush and his father George H. W. Bush, Jimmy Carter, Dwight D. Eisenhower, Harry Truman and Theodore Roosevelt. The SAR also has had among its members Sir Winston Churchill and King Juan Carlos I of Spain, both of whom trace their ancestry to **REVOLUTIONARY WAR** patriots. Membership requires proof of descent from a person who aided in the **PATRIOT** cause. Some of the activities in which we engage are:

- * commemoration of Patriot graves and monuments
- * educational programs in the schools and elsewhere on the ideals of our Patriot ancestors and the American Revolution
- * recognition of outstanding law enforcement officers and JROTC cadets
- * sponsorship of Boy Scout troops



Upcoming Patriot grave markings

John Hunt enlisted 6 Feb 1782 in the 10th NC Regiment for a period of 12 months, and is buried near Kittrell, NC. On Sat., March 21st the Halifax Resolves Chapter will be honoring his service with the placement of a SAR Patriot grave marker, with appropriate ceremony. The Warren County High School JROTC unit is expected to be there to perform color guard duties. One of his descendants is former NC Gov. Jim Hunt, and he has been invited to attend, though he has not as yet confirmed. Try to come out if you can to support your chapter and honor this Revolutionary War hero.

Colonel Whitmel Hill was born on 12 Feb 1743 in Palmyra Plantation, Halifax, NC, and died about 1797 and is buried in Scotland Neck. He was one of the leading figures from NC during the Revolution, serving as Colonel of the Martin Co. Militia, Representative at the Congresses in Hillsborough in 1775 and Halifax in 1776, a Councillor of State and a Delegate to the Continental Congress in Philadelphia. As soon as our treasury permits, we are planning to mark his grave with the SAR Patriot grave marker.
