Highlights of November, 2014 meeting

The meeting was called to order by President Geoff Pittard and the Invocation was given by Chaplain Duncan Jones. The Pledge of Allegiance and the SAR Pledge was led by Marcus Pittard. Guests were recognized by President Pittard and SAR Foundation President Dr. Samuel C. Powell spoke briefly concerning the new headquarters building in Louisville, the plans for the new museum and fund raising activities.

President Pittard reported on chapter activities since the last meeting to include a Flag Retirement with VFW Post 3702, the Joseph Shearin grave marking and the Veterans Day luncheon and parade. In addition, he had attended the Washington, NC grave markings, and the John Ashe grave marking in Clinton, NC.

NCSSAR President Ken Wilson reported on activities across the state. He updated the chapter on their ranking in the 2013 National Americanism contest and the state society's ranking. From the chapter viewpoint, he reported that we currently had 92 U.S. flags waiting retirement. He also reported that for the first time in seven years the chapter has no participants in the Knight Essay contest or the JROTC Scholarship contest.

Under new Business:

Compatriot Wilson proposed changing the funding of the Poster and Brochure contests to reflect the NCSSAR contest by providing the teacher of the winning poster or brochure with a monetary reward. Two motions were proposed and approved.

Motion #1 – Compatriot Wilson moved to amend the current Poster contest funding that provides the student with a \$100.00 scholar-ship adding a \$50.00 award to the student's teacher. The motion was seconded by E.C. Bobbitt and unanimously approved.

Motion #2 – Compatriot Wilson moved that the chapter fund the Brochure contest with \$100.00 for the winning student and \$50.00 for the winning student's teacher. The motion was seconded by Steve Pittard and unanimously approved.

Compatriots were reminded of upcoming events, i.e. the Emerald Isle Parade Nov. 29th, the Battle of Great Bridge on Dec. 6th, and the Roanoke Rapids Christmas Parade December 7th.

President Pittard presented a program entitled "German Soldiers from both sides of the Revolution".

Following his closing comments, President Pittard entertained a motion to adjourn from Compatriot Steve Pittard which was seconded by Rev. Duncan Jones; Marcus Pittard led the SAR Recessional followed by the Benediction given by Chaplain Jones.

The meeting adjourned at 8:15 pm.
