The Secretary/Treasurer's report was next given and approved. President Pittard then delivered his report:

-the Roanoke Rapids Christmas Parade is tentatively scheduled for 12/16

-the annual observance of the Battle of Great Bridge is scheduled for 12/6, and this is a National SAR event

Chapter VP RJ Myrick reported on his activities, including several Flag Certificate presentations. Past President Ken Wilson reported that the Halifax Museum is sponsoring the "Halifax Muster" and urged that the chapter make a donation, and after a vote it was decided to donate \$100.




