October 07, 2015: 235th Anniversary of the Battle of Kings Mountain. The 235th Annual Commemoration of the Battle of Kings Mountain will be held beginning at 11:00am at Kings Mountain National Battlefield Park.

October 10, 2015: 235th Anniversary of the Battle of Shallow Ford. The Battle of Shallow Ford took place west of the Yadkin River, about a mile from the Shallow Ford crossing. Around 350 Whig militiamen from North Carolina and Virginia, commanded by Maj. Joseph Cloyd, defeated a local band of Tories numbering between 400 and 900.

October 17, 2015: Unveiling Slave and Native American Cemetery Monument. You are invited to join the NCSSAR in assisting the Gov. John Archdale Chapter, National Society of Colonial Dames XVII, in the presentation and unveiling of a monument in the Slave and Native American Cemetery, Sardis Presbyterian Church, 6100 Sardis Road, Charlotte, NC, beginning at 4:00 p.m. Sixty-six markers, none marked with names or any writing, represent the graves of slaves and Native Americans.
