

Message from the President



Compatriots,

March may have been calm, but April is always a busy month for our chapter and its officers. We usually have our annual state convention and Halifax Day within a week or so of each other, and this

year was no exception.

Ken Wilson and I attended our annual state convention, which met in Hickory from Friday, April 6 through Sunday, April 8. Approximately sixty SAR members from across the state were in attendance, and most of our state chapters were represented. The first day there was a brief meeting of the South Atlantic District, followed by a very nice reception for members and spouses.

Saturday was a day full of meetings. In the morning there were training sessions dealing with the reconciliation report and the on-line application. That afternoon was a business meeting. A number of awards were presented. Our chapter won the following awards:

- Hard Copy of Scrapbook First Place
- Electronic Scrapbook Honorable Mention Small Chapter
- Americanism First Place
- Nat Clark Outstanding Small Chapter 1st Place
- Streamer for 95% retention of membership
- Streamer for Flag Certificates Awarded (For 10 or more Flag Certificates awarded)

The day finished with a wonderful banquet. Our keynote speaker was Compatriot Joe Sam Queen (also

our state Historian), who spoke on the Revolutionary campaign in western North Carolina.

The following Wednesday we cranked up again to celebrate the 242nd anniversary of the adoption of the Halifax Resolves. There was a reception at the Hilton Garden Inn to welcome our out-of-town guests, followed by dinner at Ralph's Barbecue in Weldon. Thursday morning, amid bright skies and periodic ferocious gusts of wind, we met in Halifax for our ceremony. I estimate there were more than 100 people present, including the fifth grade students from Halifax Academy, who all rendered honors by attaching miniature American flags to our chapter's two wreaths. (Among them was Avery Boone, our chapter winner for the poster contest.) We had representatives from many organization, including National Society of the SAR, the North Carolina Children of the American Revolution, the National Society of the Children of the American Revolution, the South Atlantic District of the SAR, Historic Halifax, the Halifax County Board of Commissioners, and Halifax County Government.

The guest speaker was Larry Guzy, President General of the National Society of the SAR. His topic was "Because We Remember." A wonderful lunch -- complete with fried chicken, ham, and all the trimmings -- followed at the Methodist Church, prepared by our favorite chefs – the wonderful ladies of the church.

Minutes of January, 2018, Meeting

The Treasurer's report indicated a total balance of \$2484.54, of which the subcategories include the Youth Fund with a balance of \$840.00 and the General Fund with a balance of \$1644.54. The Treasurer's report was approved. Under old business, the following topics were discussed:

- Compatriot Wilson reminded everyone of two upcoming compatriot grave markings. The grave of Compatriot James Carlos Harris will be marked on June 16 at 10AM, at the Harris family cemetery near Inez. That afternoon at 2PM, the grave of Compatriot Nicholas Bunn Boddie will be marked at Rose Hill Plantation near Nashville.
- The group discussed and approved the proposed grave marking procedures as presented at the January and March meetings by President Gammon.

Under new business, the following topics were discussed:

- President Gammon reminded everyone of the upcoming Halifax Day, scheduled for April 12, 2018. He invited everyone to come out for the event and to lend a hand with some of the duties.
- Compatriot Wilson announced that the Halifax Co. Commissioners have passed a resolution regarding Halifax Day 2018.
- On April 17, Compatriot Wilson will conduct a flag retirement.
- Concerns about the dwindling amount of money in the Youth Fund were discussed. No solutions were offered.

After the discussion of new business, Compatriot Wilson presented the entries in the poster and brochure contests. The group viewed the entries, selecting one winner in each of the two categories and several honorable mentions from each school represented.
