

SAR hosts grave dedication for soldier

American Revolution Patriot William Battle was honored on Saturday with a grave marker dedication by the Halifax Resolves Chapter of the Sons of the American Revolution (SAR)

Battle is buried in a family cemetery at a home on Cooper Road in Nash County.

Battle was born around 1758, most likely in Northampton County, the son of William and Mary Battle. His parents lived first in Edgecombe County, which is now Nash County, but later moved to Northampton County and then back to Nash County around the time of the American Revolution.

Ken Wilson, President of the Halifax Resolves Chapter of the Sons of the American Revolution, said little was known about Battle's early life except that he married Mary Ann Williams, of Halifax County, around 1785 and the couple raised nine children.

During his lifetime, Battle accumulated over 900 acres of land on Swift Creek in Nash County, which eventually fell to his nine children. According to an early published genealogy of the Battle family, he died in December 1802 as "the result of an innocent joke" but details of his death are lacking.

Wilson said Battle's service to the Revolutionary cause is documented in various pay vouchers dating between 1781 and 1783, in which he was reimbursed for his patriot service.

"He is a proven patriot on the DAR and SAR rosters." Wilson said.

The ceremony included the unveiling and dedication of a special grave marker for

Descendants of Battle, Phyllis Campbell and Sue Pittman, attended the ceremony. The sisters said they were the seventh generation of the family to live at the home on Cooper Road and were proud of their heritage.

"We're proud to be a part of this family," Campbell

"I'm very excited to be a part of this and to be a part of this seven generations, it honor to form this great na-

does my heart good," Pittman said. "This (ceremony) means so much to me."

Several chapters of SAR attended the grave marking ceremony and laid wreaths in honor of Battle. In addition, Virginia Havden and Margaret Cobb, members of the local Micajah Pettaway Chapter of the DAR. attended and laid a wreath in honor of Battle's service.

Wilson said ceremonies like the one held on Saturday were important.

"One of our many goals is the recognition of individuals who pledged their lives, their liberty and their sacred

tion," Wilson said. "It is important, not only to remember the veterans of today. but all veterans, including the first veterans. These individuals took a path that had never been taken, a path to independence."

"We are rapidly forgetting our past and what it means to be an American," Wilson added. "By conducting ceremonies like this grave marking, we are endeavoring to rekindle the memories of our past and instill the Patriotism and values of our forefathers."



The Halifax Resolves Chapter of the North Carolina Sons of the American Revolution received several awards at the National SAR Congress in Knoxville, Tennessee. These awards were presented to the chapter at a recent chapter meeting.

The chapter received the Small Chapter (1-49 members) Liberty Bell Award in recognition "of the chapter's participation in outreach education efforts and acknowledgement of community leaders for their efforts to perpetuate the efforts of the SAR." This is the first time the chapter has received this prestigious award for Americanism.

The next award was the President-General's Cup for Small Chapters (1-49 members). This award recognizes the "chapter that best achieves the goals of both the President-General's and Americanism Awards." This is the second time the chapter has received this award (2012) for the best overall program in the nation.

Of the three top small chapter awards at the national level listed above, the chapter placed first in two categories and seventh in the third category against 61 other chapters.

In recognition of the chapter's work with veterans groups, the chapter received its ninth Partners in Patriotism certificate.

The last award recognized the number of submissions of biographies of their Patriot Ancestors.



NC SAR past president remembered

The Halifax Resolves Chapter of the North Carolina Sons of the American Revolution recently dedicated an SAR marker at the grave of compatriot Ralph Hardee Rives.

The chapter was assisted by NC SAR Sr. VP James A. Becker, the combined NC SAR Color Guard and SAR members from the General George Washington, Lower Cape Fear, Old North State and Raleigh chapters. Members of the Micajah Pettaway and Warren Chapters of the NC Daughters of the American Revolution were also present.

Rives was born Nov. 24, 1930, in Rocky Mount, Nash County, the son of Ralph Cooper Rives and Lessie Day Hardee.

He studied at the University of Oxford and the University of London and received

his doctorate from the University of Virginia. Rives spent more than 30 years as an English professor at East Carolina Universitv.

On April 22, 1965, Rives was inducted into the National

Society of the Sons of the American Revolution as a descendant of Peter Rives of Pitt County. A member of the now defunct Rocky Mount chapter, Rives served as the North Carolina State President from 1972-74.

In addition to serving as the NC SAR president, Rives served as president of a number of North Carolina cultural and historical associations, including the Society of the War of 1812 in North Caroli-

na, the North Carolina Chapter of the Victorian Society in America and the Pitt County Historical Society. He was also a member of the Society of the Cincinnati, the Sons of Confederate Veterans and the Order of

the Stars and Bars and was active in historic preservation circles throughout his adult years.

Rives passed away May 20, 2016, and rests with his family in the Elmwood Cemetery in Enfield.


