

# Message from the President



### Compatriots,

Two years ago I was sworn in as your chapter president and I took the gavel from Ken Wilson. I can truly say I have learned a lot while in the position. In typical fashion, now that I am finally getting settled into the position, it is time to leave it. But two years are a

Highlights from the Minutes of September, 2019, Meeting

#### Minutes – September 11, 2019 Meeting Halifax Resolves Chapter, NCSSAR

The Halifax Resolves Chapter of the NCSSAR met on Wednesday, September 11, 2019, at the Halifax United Methodist Church in Halifax, NC. President David Gammon called the meeting to order at 6:30 pm. Our Chaplain Rev. Duncan Jones gave the invocation. Compatriot Carl Witt led the group in the Pledge of Allegiance and President Gammon led the SAR Pledge. The following guests were introduced: Dr. Sam Powell (former State President), Renny Taylor (NC History Teacher of the Year and National History Teacher of the Year) and his wife Leslie, and Andrew Duppstadt, guest speaker

After the meal, Andrew Duppstadt gave a presentation entitled "Richard Caswell: The First of Patriots and Best of Men."

In the absence of Secretary/Treasurer Steve Avent, President Gammon briefly discussed the minutes from the previous meeting, which were approved with one correction. The Treasurer's report indicated a total balance of \$2,262.51, of which the subcategories include the Youth Fund with a balance of \$890.00 and the General Fund with a balance of \$1,372.51. The Treasurer's report was approved.

During the President's Report, President Gammon mentioned that a number of chapter members had attended a DNA workshop in Rocky Mount in July, and thanked them for their interest in research.

Under old business, the following topics were discussed:

- Compatriot Michael Cooper reported there have been no new discoveries about the grave of Harrison Macon.
- Compatriot Ken Wilson reported there have been no new discoveries about possible markings of graves of patriots and compatriots.
- President Gammon went through the list of tasks formerly performed by Ken Wilson, and asked members to volunteer for those that interested them. A list is attached to these minutes.
- Compatriot Ken Wilson updated everyone on the status of the various Youth Programs and the awards associated with them. He noted a budget he had prepared, estimating the cost if we had participants in every category. If so, the cost per year to run these contests would be \$1370, but currently we only have \$890 in part of our budget designated for the Youth Fund. While we cannot predict which students and teachers might participate, we need to be ready for the largest participation. President Gammon reminded everyone that this fund is created entirely by donations, and encouraged members to donate to it.
- Compatriot Wilson reminded everyone that Renny Taylor has been a NC State History Teacher of the year for two times, and currently is the National History Teacher of the Year. Mr. Taylor mentioned the benefits of his participation.

Under new business, the following topics were discussed:

- Compatriot Ken Wilson announced that Wreaths Across America will be held December 14, and the local Veterans' Day ceremony will be November 10.
- New member Bob Bittner was installed into the chapter and presented with his rosette. New Member Preston Fortin was also presented with his rosette.
- The slate of officers for 2020-2022 was introduced. They are: Geoff Pittard (President), Michael Cooper (Secretary), Steve Avent (Treasurer), and Duncan Jones (Chaplain). The office of Vice-President remains vacant. There were no nominations from the floor, and the slate was approved by the members.


President Gammon then led the members in the SAR Recessional, Rev. Duncan Jones gave the benediction, and the meeting was adjourned at 7:50.


